Chair Report



Season 2024 - so many highlights - Lets quickly recap the year

We had 8 different clubs represented on Grand Final day. This produced a ripper crowd and some super games of football and netball. On behalf of the board, I would like to thank all the volunteers, umpires, timekeepers, scoreboard attendants, coaches, team managers, trainers and umpires who have made the 2024 such a successful finals series. The Finals Series produced fantastic gates each week, concluding with a \$66,302 gate on Sunday at our Grand Final. This is roughly 6,000 paying attendees through the gate. Total gate for the 4-week finals series was \$156,687 with a total attendance across the 4 week finals series of just under 17,000 people. Congratulations goes to our Premier clubs Echuca (4 premierships), Euroa (2 premierships), Seymour, Shepparton Swans and Mooroopna and huge kudos to Shepp Bears, Rochester, Shepp Swans, Echuca, Mooroopna, and Mansfield for your efforts on the day.

We had just on 200 people gathered at the Morrison and Wellman Family Medal Night. We all came together to celebrate the successes of not just our Best and Fairest, but our umpires, our volunteers, our coaches and administrators. The vibe at the GV Hotel was incredible, and it was a super proud moment.

We continued again with livestreaming. Numbers were pleasing – across the season and for the Grand Finals. we had commentary and special comments for all 8 games on Grand Final day, interviews pre and post–game as well as on the spot with our boundary riders. Whether it was via the App or Web, viewers were able to tune in for all parts of the world; London, Canada, Qld, NT, and local Victorians just to name a few that we are aware of.

We are sure that radio coverage via One FM and broadcasts on Seymour, Mansfield and Benalla Community Radio stations has also complimented the spread of coverage to our wider community. The additional facet of GVL Data which has been well received by clubs and the general public and provides an additional point of difference for our League.

We have made significant investments that have set the League up to have several notable points of difference. We are setting the bar high as we continue to strive to be the League of Choice and solidify our Premier League Status.

The continuation of the GVL Statistics was welcomed by clubs and coaches in particular. Costs to clubs for this was \$2,000 per club and the League had intended to cover the rest through partnerships which had been secured before the season commenced. MMG continued the widely popular GVL Data in addition to daily articles across multiple mastheads in their group, their digital channels (including social media and websites) and the GVL Data weekly newsletter. The GVL has received extensive coverage throughout the season. We thank the team at MMG.

Operations Report



Season 2024 was a year of stability as the League's football and netball clubs had a second full season post Covid-19 and local flooding. Most clubs recorded stable numbers of player registrations in both football and netball, with the only clubs falling slightly being Rochester and Shepparton Swans who both continue their recovery from the devastating floods across the region in late 2022. As the league and region continues to recover from the pandemic and flooding, it is important that our entire community is supported, and our league members continue to be strong in the Goulburn Valley community.



FOOTBALL REPORT

Despite the overall strength of the Echuca FNC, the League has become a stronger competition over the last three seasons, with the average margin in games dropping from almost 10 goals to below 8 goals in the Seniors. It is also pleasing to see smaller margins in the Reserves and U18 grades.

The two Grand Finalists in Echuca and Shepparton showed their dominance during the home and away season with only one loss and finishing 4 games clear on the ladder. However, they were certainly pushed by Rochester who had a fantastic season finishing with 13 wins including 10 in succession and the consistent challengers in Mooroopna (12 wins), Kyabram (10 wins) and Euroa (9 wins). For those clubs who missed the finals, Mansfield had a strong first half of the season before slipping away, Shepparton Swans had a very encouraging second half of the season, while Seymour struggled to find consistency. It was a challenging year for Benalla, Shepparton United and Tatura.

In the Reserves competition, Echuca proved their overall strength as a club going undefeated for the season to take-out the Premiership. There was a battle amongst Rochester, Kyabram, Euroa and Seymour as to who would challenge Echuca and Shepparton Swans showed the club can be positive about 2025. Echuca's and Shepparton's dominance from the Seniors flowed down to the Under 18 level, also finishing top two on the ladder like in the Seniors. The Shepparton Swans showed promise for the years ahead making it to the U18 Grand Final with Seymour, Mooroopna, Kyabram and Rochester showing the evenness of the competition.

Congratulations to the Echuca FNC for taking out the Senior, Reserves and U18 Premierships which is a truly amazing achievement, being the club's second clean sweep of all three grades in three years.

Finance Report

FOR PERIOD ENDING OCTOBER 31, 2024

Profit/Loss

 Net Loss for end of the 2024 F/Y is reported at -\$87,005. Of this, \$36,101 as outlined below was in relation to 2023 Finals expenses. Therefore, actual result for 2024 F/Y -\$50,904.

This 2024 F/Y result can be attributed to the following:

- \$36,101 attributed to accounts from 2023 being received in the 2024 FY. These are attributed to Finals Expenses (Venue Hire, Security/Gates & Floats) and Weekender printing expenses.
- \$16,818 attributed to a decrease in McPherson Media Group partnership value. The reduction in partnership income was the result of MMG's refusal to meet the board's partnership proposal. With negotiations being on the eve of the season, a final agreement was reached with the specification of new negotiations in 2025.
- \$11,000 honorariums; attributed to the new Netball Umpire Development Co-ordinator appointment, and accompanying honorarium and Board honorariums taken in 2024 that were not claimed in 2023.
- In 2024, Interleague expenses totalled \$42,642 compared to \$26,247 in 2023, a difference of \$16,395.
 Interleague costs were higher than the previous year, mainly due to the costs associated with the GVL hosting the games including equipment hire, live streaming, security/gates, printing of the Weekender and catering.
- A 10% increase in charges from the Greater Shepparton Council for the ground hire of Deakin Reserve for the Preliminary and Grand Finals.
- Sponsorship and Advertising income relating to the launch of the league's new app was not received as expected. This was due to significant delays in obtaining critical technical support from the AFL, ultimately leading to the app not being launched as planned.
- With the support of the Apps developer, the \$35,000 budgeted expense associated with App development has been deferred in full to 2025. The League will be focusing on achieving sponsorship and advertising targets aligned with the app in 2025.

In relation to areas where improved income or savings in expenditure were achieved during 2024;

- Live streaming and recording of finals were reduced to achieve a saving of \$34,000 against budget. The League's previous streaming platform Cluch, went into administration. The League was able to purchase a video camera and two LiveU units which allowed it to appoint a camera operator to film a football match per round. Based on prior stats, the Board determined that it would not livestream a netball match per round but would however record the match instead.
- All games are now livestreamed on Streamer platform that does not carry the costs that were incurred with our previous provider. The first three weeks of finals were streamed in the same way we streamed games during the home and away season, providing a saving of \$17,215 against the budgeted expense.
- League Presentation Night catering costs were reduced by \$5,433 against budget.
- Meeting expenditure was reduced by \$1,927 compared to budget.
- Sponsor Servicing expense budgeted at \$10,000 was not realised this season, hence why there was no actual cost for 2024. It is expected that there will be a cost for this in 2025.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2024

1 Statement of Material Accounting Policies

The financial statements are a special purpose report prepared for use by the committee. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

These financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 (Vic)*. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

(a) Property, Plant and Equipment

All property, plant and equipment except for freehold land and buildings are initially measured at cost and are depreciated over their useful lives to the association.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the committee to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of expected net cash flows that will be received from the asset's employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have been discounted to present values in determining recoverable amounts.

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated on a diminishing value basis over their estimated useful lives to the entity commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at the end of each reporting period. An asset's carrying amount is written down immediately to its recoverable amount if the asset's carrying amount is greater than its estimated recoverable amount.

(b) Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2024

(c) Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the entity is exempt from income tax under *Div 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

(d) Inventories

Inventories held for sale are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Inventories acquired at no cost, or for nominal consideration, are valued at the current replacement cost as at the date of acquisition.

(e) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities on the statement of financial position.

(f) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue from the rendering of a service is recognised upon the delivery of the service to the customer.

Donations and bequests are recognised as revenue when received.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which, for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(g) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the statement of financial position are shown inclusive of GST.

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial report, whether due to fraud or
 error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is
 sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my opinion. The risk of not detecting a material
 misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve
 collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that
 are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the
 effectiveness of the registered entity's internal control.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made by responsible entities.
- Conclude on the appropriateness of the responsible entities' use of the going concern basis of accounting and, based on the audit evidence obtained, whether a material uncertainty exists related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the registered entity's ability to continue as a going concern. If I conclude that a material uncertainty exists, I am required to draw attention in my auditor's report to the related disclosures in the financial report or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify my opinion. My conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of my auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the registered entity to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the financial report, including the disclosures, and whether the financial report represents the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

I communicate with the responsible entities regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that I identify during my audit.
